"This season I had the opportunity to coach the 5th grade girls' volleyball team. 5th graders have a vast range of skills, from those who have never touched a volleyball before to those with experience. While the athleticism of my girls varied, their coachability and team spirit did not. Each girl worked hard to improve for their team. 5th grade volleyball is notoriously known for 'if you can serve you will win'. We were fortunate to have a few solid servers from the start, but by the end of the season all my girls could serve and half now doing overhand. They achieved this through hard work and determination.

At the start of the season I also introduced the concept of positions, which most thought we were crazy to do. This led to the girls having more interaction with the ball and 3-hits and required them to really work as a team. Now while 3-hits isn't always the best in 5th grade, often leading to more errors than points, it helped pull the team together as they worked to get it over. And every time they got to cheer 'bump-set-spike it, cause that's the way we like it' it energized them.

Ultimately, we went on to have a winning season, 10-0 for the regular season, losing only a few sets. We took home a 1^{st} and 2^{nd} place finish in our tournaments.
