Our Athletic Board works very diligently to make sure our athletics are both running efficiently and growing effectively. I have been so impressed with the efforts that our board members make in a positive way in my time on the Board. this game-day experience and we encourage everyone to get involved in any capacity– it makes a huge difference.
